INVITE THE AUTHOR TO YOUR BOOK DISCUSSION

You may have seen me on television as Cynthia in ROOTS: The Next Generations or as T.C. the Plumber's Helper in Good Times. Or maybe you caught me tracking bad guys as forensics expert Lily Morgan in Burke's Law, or saw me play a vampire in the Cliffhangers series, or laughed as I managed a political campaign as Gloria in Major Dad. And if you're a daytime TV fan, you might've watched me on Ryan's Hope and Days of Our Lives.

If you think you recognize me from McDonald's, Pampers, Yoplait, Best Buy and other national commercials, you're right. And you've probably heard me announcing promos for ABC network shows or voicing ads for Chevrolet, Federal Express, KFC, Bank of America and other major brands. I've done voice-overs for animations too, like The Little Engine That Could, Little Nemo, Scooby Doo, The Smurfs, Batman, The Pound Puppies, Captain Caveman and The Flintstone Kids.

What you might not know is that I studied writing while getting my B.A. from Stanford, earned a masters degree from the Yale University School of Drama, and went on to perform on Broadway and in movies. These experiences inspired me to pen celebrity interviews about fellow actors and musicians, one of which, published in Essence magazine, won the American Diabetes Association National Media Award. Games



WHO SAID IT

Write down quotes from Twelve Stories High and place them in a hat, bowl or other container. Have each member pull a quote and read it to the group. Have members note in their phones which character said it, to whom, when, and why it was said, and in which story and setting. The best detail guesser wins.

WHO IS IT

On paper or 3x5 cards, jot down Twelve Stories High story titles and character names. Place cards face down. Choose teams. For each turn, set a 2 or 3-minute time limit using a phone timer. Have a member pick a card and act out its topic for their teammates to guess. After several rounds, the team with the shortest time wins.

WHODUNNIT

For each of the twelve mysteries, invite members to devise a victim different than the one in the *Twelve Stories High* story. Try existing characters or dream up new ones during your meeting. Put your heads together to figure out the motive, method, and most importantly, the villain who perpetrated the crime.

FOOD

Host a potluck meeting! Clubbers can look up online recipes at <u>eatthis.com</u> or <u>allrecipes.com</u> and prepare historic Southern dishes like those in the plot of Cooking with Glass. Or your group could get together to bake a princess cake like Cherrie's in With a Cherrie on Top, and make the meeting a book club tea party.

FASHION

Each clubber can bring a foam core board and their favorite fashion magazines, and spend part of your meeting creating fashion boards of clothes their favorite characters might wear. Or alternatively, bring home magazines to design houses and furnishings their most aspirational *Twelve Stories High* characters might live in.

FANTASY

All it takes is a sketch pad and some pencils, colored pencils, watercolors or charcoals to set your clubbers' imaginations free to draw or paint images of how they picture their most memorable *Twelve Stories High* characters. Share among yourselves, or scan and post, or frame to decorate your home or office walls.

DRESS UP

Have a Costume Book Club Party! Dress as your favorite Twelve Stories High characters at your discussion meeting and have fun guessing who is whom.



Get your Book Club talking with questions that make members think, reflect, remember, consider, relate, learn from each other, and grow closer as a group.



ASK & ANSWER Explore

- 1. What is your favorite Twelve Stories High story? What did you like best about it?
- 2. Who is your favorite Twelve Stories High character?
- 3. If you could be the main character of one of the stories, who would you be? Why?
- 4. Do any of the characters reflect who you once were or would like to someday be?
- 5. Which character would you like to meet. Where and why would you meet them?
- 6. Which character would you not like to meet? What would you do or say if you did?
- 7. What story ending did you figure out before you got to it?
- 8. What plot twists surprised, shocked, or kept you guessing?
- 9. Do you see a theme connecting the stories? What is it? Does it resonate with you?

ASK & ANSWER Enlighten

- 10. What Twelve Stories High story made you laugh or cry? Why did it?
- 11. Are there characters in the book you feel are relationship goals?
- 12. Which character behaved as you do or did things you would never do?
- 13. What character voice do you feel may be that of the author, and why?
- 14. Which stories do you hope become full-length novels or TV shows?
- 15. Cast actors you would like to see star in a movie of those stories.
- 16. What did you like most about reading Twelve Stories High?
- 17. Do you usually read short stories, and do you enjoy them in a collection?
- 18. If Bever-leigh participates in your discussion, what would you like to ask her?

ASK & ANSWER Express

- 19. How did reading Twelve Stories High make you feel?
- 20. What was your favorite story setting—California, Barbados, Florida, Tennessee?
- 21. Have you ever visited or lived in one of the locations? Did a story bring back memories?
- 22. Did the different mysteries intrigue and involve you?
- 23. Does the Twelve Stories High book cover appeal to you?
- 24. Do you feel the book cover reflects the contents of the book?
- 25. What other books are comparable to this one, or is it unique?
- 26. Are there elements of the stories that tie them together?
- 27. What 5 words describe the Twelve Stories High sheroes as a group?



ASK & ANSWER

Examine

- 28. Is Twelve Stories High the right length, or would you rather it be shorter or longer?
- 29. Was the pace fast enough for you?
- 30. Is there something in the book you still wonder about?
- 31. Do the stories stick with you? If so, is that due to the characters, narratives, or plots?
- 32. Did the Twelve Stories High title intrigue you? What other title might you create?
- 33. Are the stories in the best order? How might you order them differently?
- 34. Did you read the book in a device? Which one? (laptop, reader, tablet, or phone?)
- 35. Which format do you read most—hardcover, paperback, eBook, or audiobook?
- 36. Will you recommend Twelve Stories High to a friend?



ASK & ANSWER

Expand

- 37. Do you want to be a beta reader for the new mystery novel Bever-leigh is working on?
- 38. Can you guess the astrological signs of the main characters?
- 39. What advice can you give a main character that might change her story?
- 40. Did the stories end the way you hoped? How might you change an ending?
- 41. What do you imagine happens in the lives of the main characters after their story is over?
- 42. Would you feel comfortable calling the police if, like the heroines, you were in danger?
- 43. What is a positive encounter you have had with a police officer? A negative encounter?
- 44. As a group, see how many characters you can name for each story. Ready, set, go.
- 45. What songs can you associate with the stories? Assemble a Twelve Stories High playlist!
